Ideas for schools:

- Prevent Suicide PA is launching its 7th annual high school PSA contest for suicide prevention on World Suicide Prevention Day (September 10th), with submissions due by Friday, November 16th. 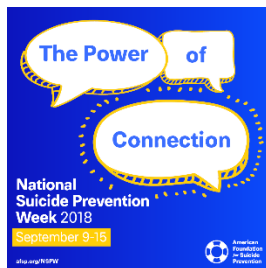

State Initiatives

- In June 2014, [Act 71](#) was passed in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania as House Bill 1559. The law requires every school entity to 1) adopt suicide prevention policies and procedures; and 2) provide 4 hours of suicide prevention training to educators in grades 6-12 every 5 years. Schools must also integrate youth suicide prevention and awareness programming for students.
- The Garrett Lee Smith [Suicide Prevention in Pennsylvania Schools and Colleges Initiative](#) is a five-year grant awarded to the Pennsylvania Office of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services (OMHSAS). The project targets youth ages 10-24 and provides awareness, training, and screening activities within schools, colleges, and behavioral health agencies throughout the Commonwealth.
- For over 30 years, the [Pennsylvania Network for Student Assistance Services](#) (PNSAS) and school Student Assistance Programs (SAP) have partnered to address youth suicide prevention/intervention efforts in the Commonwealth. Together, PNSAS, the Garrett Lee Smith Initiative, Act 71, and Prevent Suicide PA are working with school SAP teams to build a stronger safety net for our youth and to help prioritize suicide prevention in Pennsylvania schools and communities.
